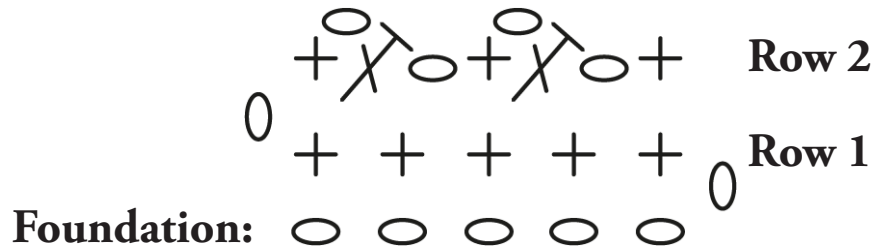


Tiny Crochet Lace Pattern

This crocheted lace makes great trim for doll clothing. I used tatting thread for Hitty's Library Dress, but you can experiment with the hook and thread sizes for different results. It also makes cute collars!



Repeat Pattern for Lace



Materials:

Size 80 cotton tatting thread (Lizbeth brand)
Metal crochet hook size 6 (1.80 mm)
Magnifying visor (recommended)

○ chain	⋈ double crochet (U.S. Terms)
+ single crochet	

Foundation Chain: make as many chains as you need for length (in odd numbers) plus one.

Row 1: sc in each ch to end; ch 1, turn.

Row 2: sc in first sc; *(ch 1, dc, ch 1) in same sc, skip one sc, sc in next sc; repeat from * to end.
Fasten off.

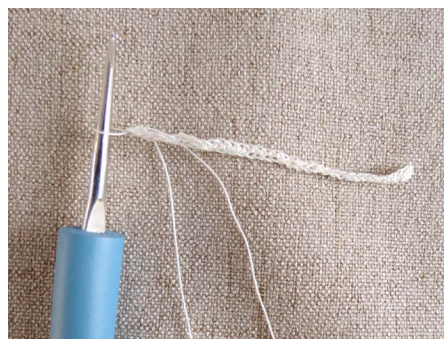
Weave in ends with a large-eyed needle. Press lace with warm iron to flatten before sewing.

Notes: Extra chains are not a problem, because you can always gather the lace to fit.
For Hitty's Library Dress, I used 33 chains for the sleeves and 49 chains for the neckline.

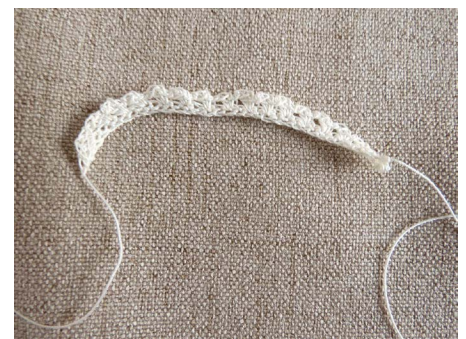
Foundation Chain
